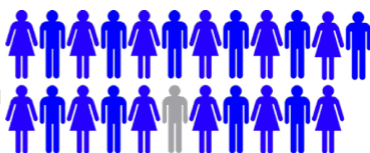
COLORECTAL CANCER IS THE

About 52,000 people in the United States will die from colorectal cancer in 2019 with about 140,000 new cases being diagnosed. In Illinois alone, about 2,200 people will die and about 6,300 new cases will be diagnosed with this deadly disease.

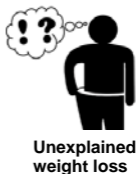
6 out of 10 colorectal
